

## COVID 19 can be overcome with vaccination

One year has passed since the start of COVID 19. More than 80,000 people were infected, of which about 1,500 people died. The sure way to beat COVID 19 is through vaccination. Haeundae is planning to operate a vaccination center at the Haeundae Cultural Complex Center in Jaesong-dong, which is located in the center of the district and has relatively good traffic. One team can vaccinate 600 people a day, but Haeundae plans to operate two teams. Currently, plans are to operate from the third quarter (after July) when the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are supplied, but plans are to start vaccination from May if the vaccines are introduced earlier. There are plans to select 50-100 con-signed medical institutions, starting with nursing hospitals.

29th: Approximately 1,400 employees and users at hot spring centers were inspected  
All tested negative  
31st: During June-August 6.89 million people visited Haeundae Beach 0 confirmed cases

### September

10th: Haeundae residents run their own cleaning day



### October

12th: Operation of Disinfection Day with Haeundae

### November

11th: Operation of Haeundae resident blood donation day



### December

9th: Haeundae Health Center Respiratory Clinic established  
25th: Temporary Screening Inspection Office begin operations at Haeundae Station

## Be strong! The warm comfort of the twinkling lights



The 7th Haeundae Light Festival will be held until March 28th. It was initially scheduled to open in November last year, but was temporarily suspended due to the spread of COVID 19. On February 15, it regained spark as social distancing was eased. Light fixtures are turned on from 6:30pm to 10 pm. Haeundae has 60 people, including quarantine personnel and volunteers, to ensure social distancing measures are kept to at the venue and to conduct activities to remind people to wear masks.



## Haeundae River Cruise in Operation: The spectacular views of River Suyeong with playful mullets

Haeundae River Cruise, an urban cruise that connects the sea and the river, started its first voyage in November last year. There is a boarding area in APEC Naru Park across from Busan Cinema Center. The River Cruise runs on a route where you can see Marine City and Gwangan Bridge after passing upstream through Busan Cinema Center and Jwasuyeong Bridge. The maximum number of people on board is 20, but at present up to 12 people are permitted. There are three cruise operation programs. Day cruises run 3 times from 11am to 3pm, and night cruises run every hour between 5pm to 9pm. The duration time is 1 hour, and Haeundae residents are eligible for discounts. The dinner cruise, which operates at 5pm and 6pm, has been temporarily suspended due to the aftereffects of COVID 19.
