

Construction of Playground Tailored to Pets in Songjeong

Haeundae have finished the construction of a pet playground and it is scheduled to open to the public next year. The pet playground will include facilities for outdoor activities, a green area, a sandpit for playing and a parking lot for visiting pet owners. In addition, there are playballs for small to medium sized dogs and areas for dog behavior and

house-training. You can use this fun place for free by making a reservation online. Plans are in place to open a pet school and to hold the Busan International Animal Rights Film Festival there as well.



10 Public Feeding Stations for Stray Cats to be Determined by End of Year

The placement of ten feeding stations for stray cats including two places in Dongbaek Island is in progress and is scheduled to be complete by the end of this year. Haeundae selected the most urgently needed spots from a total of 135 places identified by residents across the Haeundae area to start with. The places have been

evenly selected across regions in ten areas including Dongbaek Island, Haeundae Station, and Green Railway among others. Haeundae has also arranged for dedicated management personnel to provide food and cleaning. In addition, the street cats of Haeundae district will be neutered and vaccinated against rabies as part of the city government's efforts to protect these furry citizens.

Mt. Wau Newly Renovated with Forest Path, Playground, Workout Space and Pet playground

Haeundae has added various relaxing spaces to Mt. Wau by renovating the original walking path.

The once 1.8-kilometer-long forest path has been turned into nine theme parks including an entrance area, a space for work

ing out, a Gongyoo Garden, a playground tailored for pets and much more. From the planning phase, Haeundae-gu made efforts to reflect resident's requests and to make the most of the original forest ecosystems in an environmentally friendly way.





Haeundae Green City Included in Nation's 1st Generation New Town Maintenance Projects

The government plans to conduct a research study for the 1st generation of New Town redevelopment projects, and Haeundae Green City area has been included on the list. The areas named under this redevelop-

ment project include Bundang, Ilsan in Gyeonggi-do province, Haeundae Green City in Busan, and Yeonsu-gu in Incheon. It has been 30 years now since the creation of most of these areas. The master plan

for the project is to be established in 2024 after a thorough preliminary study is conducted in the second half of the year. While Haeundae Green City has great access to public transportation

and an excellent education environment, more than 90% of the apartments in this area are 30 years old now by age.

The Best Places to Visit in Haeundae this Fall

Yacht Experience River Cruise on Suyeong River

The Haeundae River Cruise that departs from Naru Park now provides a service with a newly added fleet that accommodates up to 43 guests. Sailing along the Suyeong River, it will take you on a tour of day-time city center scenery, or the colorful night scenery showcasing the lights of the Busan Cinema Center. During the day, polaroid photo services are provided for you to make unforgettable memories and at night, a colorful firework show is displayed. Light refreshments will be provided. The maximum number of



passengers on a cruise is 40 and the fee for adults is 20,000 won for day-time cruises and 10,000 won for children.

Haeundae Beach Train and Sky Capsule

The 4.8km-long section between Mipo and Songjeong has been on the rise as a tourist attraction in Busan after its eco-friendly renovation. Haeundae Beach Train, designed for tourism purposes, runs from Haeundae Mipo Station to Songjeong via Cheongsapo, and a one-way trip from start to finish takes 30 minutes. Tickets cost from 7,000-13,000 won per person. It operates three times per hour and the time of the last journey is subject to change depending on the season. The Sky Capsule is an aerial viewing



capsule train where you can appreciate a panoramic view of the Busan sea on the elevated railway 7-10 meters above ground. It also takes 30 minutes for a one-way trip. The Sky Capsule can hold from 2-4 people and tickets range from 30,000-44,000 won.
