New Haeundae District Office Building Starts Construction at End of April



Haeundae-gu will have a groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of its new office building in the afternoon of 26th of April. The new Haeundae-gu building will be located in the site across from Haeundae-gu Cultural Complex Center in

Jaesong-dong and built with eight floors and two basement levels with expected completion in May 2027. The new building will feature not only office space for each department of the district office, but also various cultural spaces for residents, such as

an open plaza, a daycare center, a library, a cultural lecture room, and a book cafe. The existing government building in Jung-dong was built in 1981 and was small and had old facilities. As a result, an annex, called the Cultural Complex Center,

was built in Jaesong-dong, and some departments were dispersed between the two locations, causing considerable inconvenience to residents.

Construction of Haewol and Cheongsapo Daritdol Observatory Ready by June



The expansion of Skywalk also known as “Cheongsapo Daritdol Observatory,” one of the most famous tourist attractions of Busan, and completion of construction of the “Haewol Observatory” is expected in June. The Cheongsapo Daritdol Observatory will be expanded from its current straight shape to a U shape and Haewol Observatory will be newly built which will be 137m in length and 3m in width. It was originally planned to in

stall the upper structure at the end of last year and open it to the public in March. However, due to an unusually long rainy season and typhoons last summer, the construction plan had to be changed several times, and part of the coastal trail was blocked, resulting in a longer construction period. Haeundae-gu plans to install the upper structure in April and the coastal walkway section will be open to enjoy before completion.

Call 112 for Emergencies and Use Translation Services 24/7

The National Police Agency has expanded the 112 Report Foreign Language Interpretation Service to 24 hours a day for foreign tourists, international students, and multicultural fam

ilies. Since June of last year, the National Police Agency has hired four interpreters in two foreign languages (English and Chinese) and provided the service on weekdays (9am to 9pm).

As the 112 report translation services did not fully cover the times required, twelve additional interpreters were selected and service operation was expanded to 24 hours a day, 365 days a

year. The National Police Agency also plans to expand interpretation languages to include Japanese and Vietnamese in the future.



Fully Enjoy Spring on Moontan Road

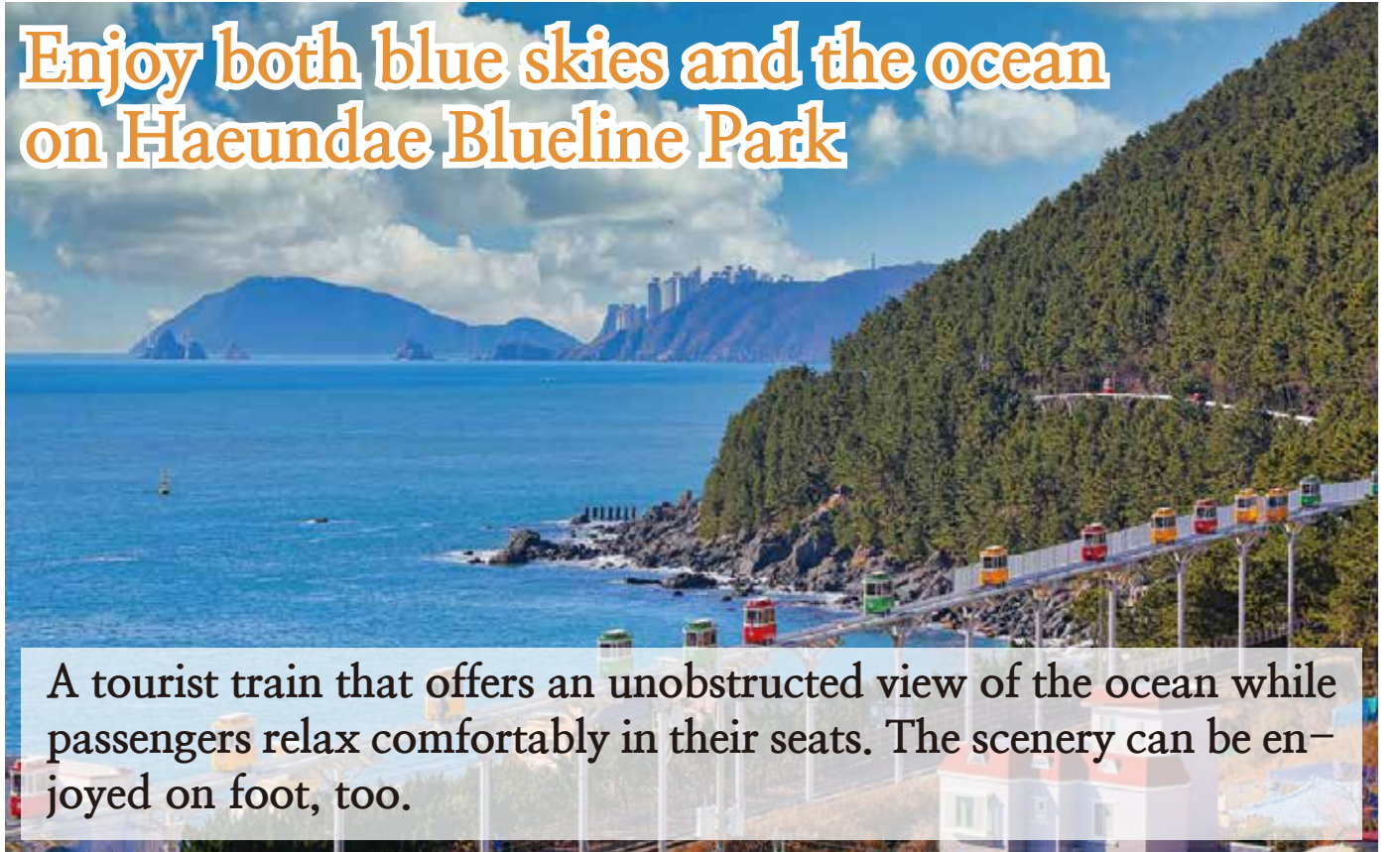

All the amateur photographers with their cameras on tripods look so professional.

Moontan Road with dirt track heals walkers

A trail where either one can wander around the place or go in the Songjeong Beach direction. The loop course is split into five sections. At the middle of the path, there is a passageway linking with the main road, so walkers can take a walk on an easier route, if feeling too tired.

Haewoljeong and Chamber with moonlit ocean views

The scenery where you can calmly look down to the horizon in the distance is exquisite. In the square in front of the pavilion, Dennis Oppenheim's final sculpture (posthumously completed) 'Chamber' is shining. This artwork was originally installed at Haeundae Beach but was moved here and restored.

Dalmaji Eoulmadang with fascinating performances
