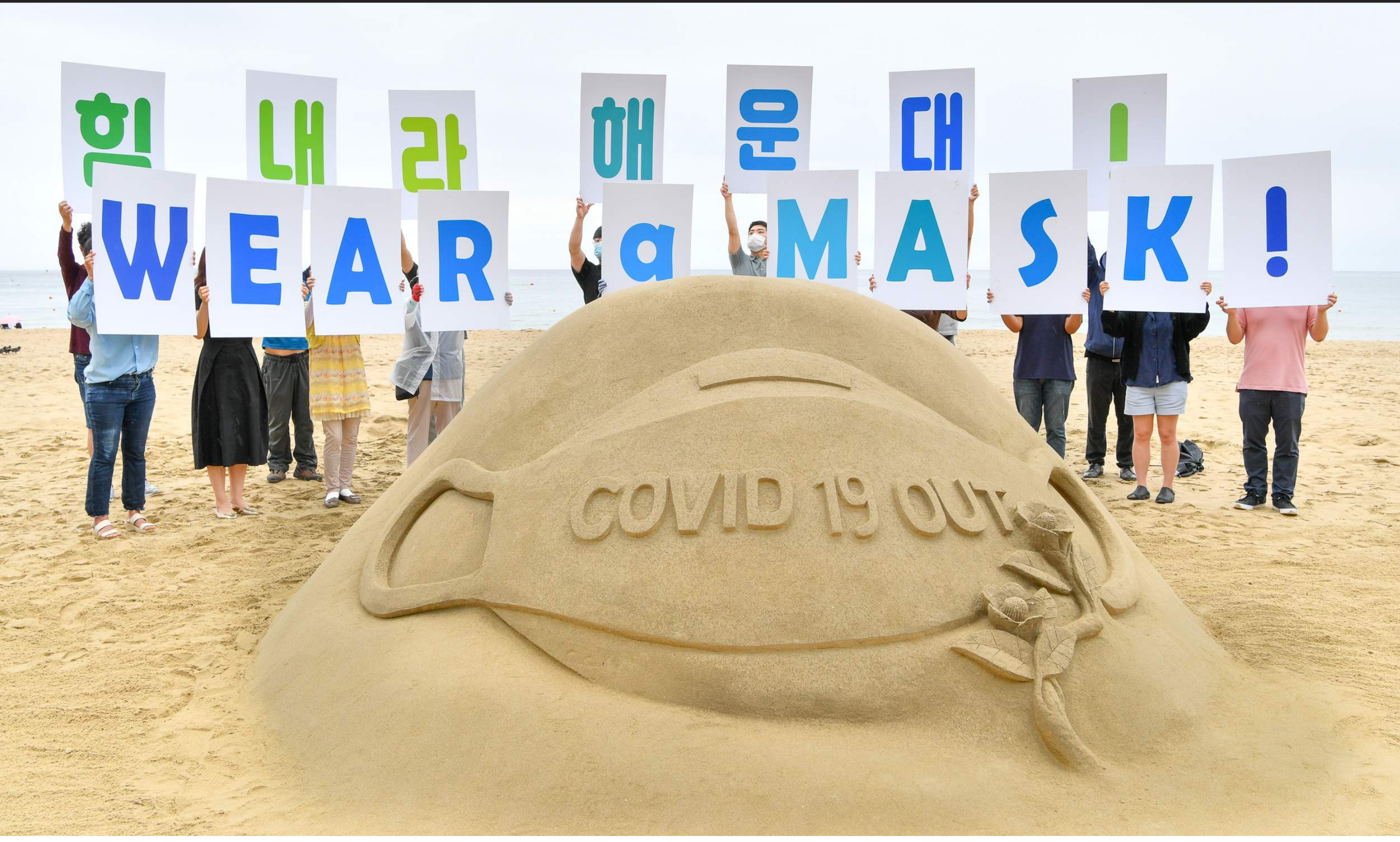

Please wear a mask at Haeundae and Songjeong Beaches.
Haeundae exhibited a mask-shaped sand sculpture inscribed with the words 'Overcome COVID 19' in front of Haeundae Beach Event Plaza in order to induce beach visitors to wear masks. Visitors to Haeundae and Songjeong Beaches must wear a mask, and the gathering of 2 or more people from 7pm to 6am the next day to drink alcohol or eat is not permitted. Violation is subject to a fine of 3 million won.

Growing vegetables for comfort

Haeundae Dementia Relief Center recently held a rooftop gardening program for 9 weeks. Twenty elderly people with dementia and their families participated in this program, which was held on the rooftop of the Haeundae Public Health Center. Participants in the program planted vegetables and herbs and learned how to manage the vegetable garden. Haeundae Dementia Relief Center believes that spending time with other people, touching soil and growing vegetables will offer comfort not only to the elderly with dementia but also to their families.

Pay your Songjeong Beach parking fee by smartphone

Haeundae introduced a smartphone app payment method to solve the problem of unfair charges for public parking at Songjeong Beach, which has happened every year. The smartphone app payment method introduced this year takes a photo of the car license plate upon entering and then enables payment by credit card upon exiting. The method accurately calculates the parking time so drivers do not need to pay excessive parking fees. If you don't have a credit card, you can pay with a deposit-only account. Haeundae also created new parking attendant jobs for more than 80 young adults.



Use public toilets without worry

Haeundae installed safety devices in public toilets in the area to prevent illegal photographing and filming crimes. The 'safety screen' installed in Haeundae's two public toilets at Haeundae Beach is a device that prevents cases of cellphones being pushed between the partitions above and below the toilet for illegal photographing and filming. Haeundae has installed CCTVs, safety bells, and safety mirrors in public toilets, and is constantly checking for illegal photographing devices.



Walking along Songjeong Old Road

Songjeong Old Road, a walkable forest road connecting Haeundae and Songjeong, was opened to the public in May. Songjeong Old Road is a 2km-long uphill path connecting Songjeong Beach in front of the Busan Environmental Corporation in Jwadong. It was frequently used by residents during the Japanese colonial period, but use was prohibited after army depots were installed during the Korean War. Afterwards, although restrictions were lifted the pass was used only by a few hikers. Haeundae has transformed this area, where only a part of the path and old army depots remain, into Songjeong Old Road where history and culture coexist. The trail starts from the Metasequoia Forest Road, passes through the 'Memory Shelter', Singoksan Observatory, and continues on to Songjeong Beach. In the 'Memory Shelter', the roof of the old army depot was removed, and some of the walls and iron gates were preserved for historical traces. From Singoksan Observatory, you can see the views of Songjeong from one spot, and you can even see as far as Osiria Tourism Complex. Coming down from the observatory, the path divides into a wide and smooth accessible road and the steep old Songjeong uphill path.
