A Green Light for the Haeundae City Airport Terminal Construction

As plans for the Gimhae New Airport were abolished, a green light was turned on for the construction of the downtown airport terminal, which Haeundae has continuously proposed. The city center airport terminal is a facility that allows you to take care of travel procedures such as checking-in for flights and luggage in the city center. Tourists and participants of MICE events can conveniently carry out airport check-in procedures in the city center. Last year, Haeundae made a proposal for the city airport terminal to be built in the basement of the Shinsegae Department Store Centum City parking lot last year, and Busan City also concluded a location nearby to BEXCO would be an ideal location for the airport terminal. If plans for the Gadeok New Airport are carried forward, it is expected that the installation of the city center airport terminal will gain momentum as the distance from the city center becomes farther than the distance from Gimhae Airport.



Decision to transform Old Haeundae Station into a park

The Old Haeundae Station Historical Park construction plan, which had seen conflict over the demolition and preservation of the Palgakjeong Pavilion, passed conditional consideration by the Busan City Park Committee. Haeundae decided to turn the site into a cultural park and held an open discussion meeting with local residents and civic groups, and made agreements to preserve Palgakjeong Pavilion by preserving only the pillars and removing the annexed buildings. Haeundae plans to transform this space into a venue for local festivals and cultural arts performances and exhibitions.

Haeundae triathlon ITU World Cup

ITU Triathlon World Cup to be held in Haeundae next year

Haeundae will host the 2021 World Triathlon Cup Haeundae at Haeundae Beach, Dongbaek Island, and Marine City from July 1-4 next year. This is Busan's first world event approved by World Triathlon and more than 2,500 athletes and enthusiasts from all over the world are expected to participate. A triathlon is a race in which swimming, cycling, and marathon are done in succession without breaks. Competitions such as swimming at Haeundae Beach, cycling on the beach-front road and Marine City, and marathon competitions at Dongbaek Island and Haeundae Beach Road will take place. Haeundae was approved by World Triathlon as an ideal choice for the event for its accessibility as athletes can easily find the venue through Gimhae Airport, abundant accommodation facilities, and beautiful natural environment.



Completion of the relaxing trail 'Green Railway' after 7 years

On November 6, the abandoned site of the Donghae Nambu Line passing through Haeundae was reborn as the 'Green Railway'. In 2013, Busan City began plans for a project to create a 9.8km-long promenade on the existing coastal railroad by relocating the Haeundae section of the Donghae Nambu Line to the inland and the project was finally completed after 7 years. The works began on the first section, the Olympic Intersection-Busan National Mechanical Technical High School and works on the second section, the Busan National Mechanical Technical High-Mipo section was completed in 2017. This time, the 3rd section, the 4.8km-long Mipo-Old Songjeong Station section, was completed. Section 3 contains various attractions such as Haeundae Beach Train and Sky Capsule, which attracts many tourists. The Beach Train runs from Haeundae Beach to Mipo, Cheongsapo, Gudeokpo and Songjeong Beach, and you can see the sea from all seats. Sky Capsule is an aerial viewing capsule that automatically runs 2.3km from Cheongsapo to Mipo on a 10-meter-long aerial rail.

Let's enjoy River Suyeong on a romantic river cruise

The River Cruise service, which enables you to enjoy the beautiful scenery of River Suyeong in Haeundae, began operation on November 6. The Haeundae River Cruise is a 20-seater and operates as a 50-minute trip from Naru Park, returning from Gwajeong Bridge in the upstream direction of River Suyeong, passing through Millak Waterfront Park and returning to the starting point. During the day, you can see mullet fish play in the waters of River Suyeong while enjoying a refreshing river breeze, and at night you can enjoy the beautiful night scenery of APEC Naru Park,



where the Big Loop of Busan Cinema Center and art sculptures from Busan Biennale shine. Haeundae River Cruise operates 8 times a day from 11am to 7pm at 2 hour intervals and at 8pm, 9pm and 10pm. The fee for adults is 25,000 won for daytime cruises and 30,000 won at night.
