

2nd Line of Busan Metro to be Extended to Osiria

Construction of the Osiria line, an extension of the Busan metro's 2nd line, has been confirmed. Line number 2 will be extended approximately 4.13km from Jangsan station in Jwadong to the Osiria Tourism Complex in Gijang-gun. This extension will relieve the traffic congestion during the weekday rush hours, and weekends, further revitalizing tourism for Songjeong beach. In addition, Busan city declared it was introducing express trains on line number 2, which will stop at eleven stations and run 30 min

utes faster than regular trains. Haeundae green city Jangsan-ro has been something akin to a parking lot on weekends. As the only road towards DongBusan Tourism Complex, Songjeong and Haeundae tunnels have also suffered severe traffic jams. The newly introduced Osiria line is expected to reduce traffic jams, improve accessibility to the city center, and help to revitalize the local tourism economy.



Smart Safe City with AI

Haeundae-gu has installed an 'Intelligent Selective Control System' by incorporating AI technology to the CCTV integrated control center. This system automatically detects loitering, falling, intrusions, smoke, violence, and other abnormal behavior of people or cars and then selectively puts the scene on the primary monitor to immediately alarm the staff. Haeundae-gu established the integrated CCTV control center on the first floor of the Haeundae-gu office in 2014 and installed 1,710 CCTVs to prevent crimes and disasters. The CCTV cameras are monitored 24 hours a day by staff working shifts. Haeundae-gu will install more CCTVs applied with more enhanced technology.





Construction of New Haeundae-gu Office Speed up for Regional Balanced Development

Haeundae-gu has newly organized a ‘New Haeundae-gu Office Construction Council’ on the 1st of January and started the project resolutely. Haeundae-gu will build a new 8-story building with 2 basement levels of the Haeundae-gu office with a parking lot accommodating 350 cars in the vacant 13,084m² area in front of the Haeundae-gu culture complex center

across from the Centum elementary school in Jaesong-dong. The construction will begin in 2023 after the design phase in 2022 and will be completed in December 2024. The construction cost is about KRW95billion except for the price (KRW53.8billion) of land owned by Haeundae-gu.

Six Creative Workshops in Bansong-dong, Haeundae



Haeundae-gu purchased vacant housing and an unused space in the Bansong area to turn them into creative workshops for artists and will recruit artists as tenants. Any artists 34 years old and under and who are art school graduates (or graduates-to-be) can apply until the 25th of February by email (99jueun@korea.kr) or visit the Urban Regeneration Division in the Haeundae-gu office. The two teams selected as tenants will be able to use

the artists’ creative workshops 1 and 2 in Bansong 2dong for two years for free. They will receive around KRW1.3million per month for a project to create cultural jobs over the two years. They can also have priority to use the Haeundae exhibition hall, ‘Atelier’ which was the old Haeundae train station. Workshops 1 and 2 will be completed in April, and four more workshops will be organized.

Old Military Barrack in Cheongsapo Beach Reborn as Cultural Resting Place for Residents

The old Cheongsapo Military Barracks (San 42-66, Jung-dong), located between Mipo and Cheongsapo green railway trail, has been reborn as a cultural gallery. Haeundae-gu refurbished this place for exhibitions and visiting and was officially opened to the public on the 24th of January. This barrack was purportedly installed to guard Cheongsapo beach area after a spy boat from North Korea infiltrated it in 1985. Haeundae-gu discussed with the military camp and decided to utilize the space for residents. They cleaned and repaired the surroundings and will provide access to the gallery to residents for free.
