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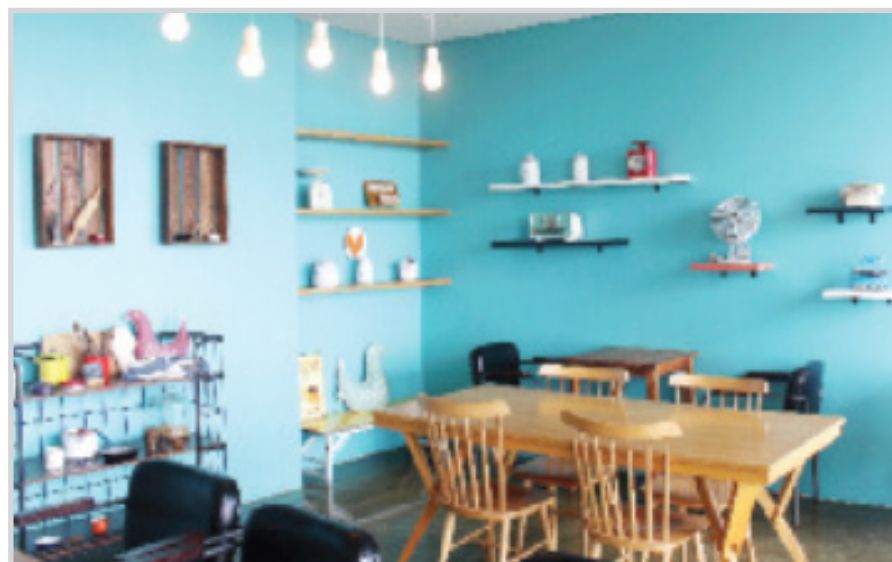

HAEUNDAE BUCKET LIST 2 REST AND RELAXATION AT A CAFÉ ON DALMAJI HILL



The Dalmaji Hill, located on a steep hill and with various cafes and galleries, is called the 'Montmartre of the East'. After taking a leisurely walk and upon entering a cafe, the blue sea gets caught in the glass like a painting in a picture frame. Outside the window, the sunshine which pours into the sparkling sea and the landscape which stretches beyond the café all blend together to wash away fatigue from daily life.

Bakehouse

Located on the 4th floor of the S Plus (S+) building opposite the Haewoljeong on Dalmaji Hill, Bakehouse is renowned for its great views. This café sells more than 30 kinds of bread made from organic ingredients and natural fermented yeast. You can enjoy watching bread being baked in an open kitchen. On weekends, there is also a cooking class for children to join.

Douce Forêt

Douce Forêt means 'sweet forest', and like its name the café is well-known for its sweet desserts. It is a simple café located in a residential area which can be easily overlooked. It sells homemade cookies, crepes and desserts that are slightly less sweet, and its fresh juices are also popular. The exclusive 'Haeundae Sea Cake', which symbolizes the waves of Haeundae, is only sold here.

TIME DEVOTED TO THINKING ABOUT THE MEANING OF LIFE AND FAMILY

A photo exhibition of the famous photographer group 'Magnum Photos' will be held at the 'Koeun Photo Museum' in U-dong, Haeundae until May 8th. Magnum Photos is one of the most influential photographer groups in the world, and the subject of this exhibition is HOME. At this exhibition, there are about 180 photographs by 16 photographers. The artists who participated in this exhibition are Mark Power, Elliott Erwitt, Alec Soth, David Alan Harvey, Thomas Dworzak, Alessandra Sanguinetti, Moises Saman, Hiroji Kubota and Alex Webb. The photos express in various meanings themes such as hometown, home, family, and heart, and enable modern people to look at the theme of 'home' from a new perspective. According to the studio, this exhibition "shows how photographers have captured their family and life on camera, and how each individual photographer interprets his own life." Also, the studio adds that the exhibition will serve to "give visitors time to think about life and family, which represents 'home', and what this means to you".



BANYEO-DONG MARKET: WHERE THERE IS EVERYTHING BUT NOTHING



The market in an alley in Banyeo 3-dong was first established as an underground shopping center in 1965 and has now grown into a market with approximately 60 stores. At the entrance to the market there are specialty stores selling handmade fish paste which deliver nationwide by courier service. Right next door, there is a restaurant that operates 24 hours a day, and there are also stores selling various side dishes at cheap prices nearby. The market has everything, from a florists, butchers, bakery, fishmonger, miller to clothes stores. It is a shame there is no parking lot. The market is usually most crowded between 4-6 pm. The market turns on 9 LED lights between the hours of 9pm and 6am to provide comfort and security to residents.



HAEUNDAE RANKED BUSAN'S NUMBER 1 BY LOCAL GOVERNMENT EVALUATION

Haeundae-gu ranked fourth among 69 places in the nation's local government evaluation and ranked 1st among 16 places in Busan. The evaluation was conducted by the Korean Association for Local Government Studies under the sponsorship of the Ministry of the Interior and Safety. Haeundae-gu has been ranked number 1 in the ability to manage delinquent taxes and 12th place in the residents' evaluation. Last year, it ranked 14th overall but moved up to 4th place this year. Haeundae-gu office received a high score in the evaluation of the local government because the office gained popularity after implementing a program where the office head directly receives and solves residents' complaints.
