Haeundae, Good Place to Live and Visit, Haeundae-gu Vision of the 8th Popular Vote

The 2nd Centum Urban High-Tech Industrial Complex has been established to become an ICT convergence hub valley. Moving the new office to Jaesong-dong will lay the foundations for balanced development between the west and east. The current office will be used as a public facility that will reflect residents' opinions. Haeundae-gu will provide expanded support for young start-ups and organize an urban-residential and start-up complex space for people in their 20s and 30s. Other projects to promote the tourism industry include building a library with an ocean view where

people can read books while observing the sea. The Haeundae arboretum will be turned into a travel attraction; culture and art streets shall be revitalized; a healing center in Haeundae-gu for pregnant women will be installed; and the 24-hour childcare system will be enhanced to provide residents with strengthened childcare services. In addition, to relieve chronic traffic congestion, the Haeundae and Bansong tunnels will be opened earlier; metro line No. 2 will be extended without delay; and detours are to be secured.



Top of Jangsan Mountain Opened on June 28

Jangsan Mountain is finally available to the public. The summit of the mountain was used as a military base camp after the Korean War. After a series of discussions with Haeundae-gu, opening the top to the public has been given the green light up to a certain level, which does not interfere with military operations.

The top of the mountain is open from 10am to 3pm to the public. Safety supervisors are stationed there during the opening hours for visitor safety and to provide guidance around the military facilities.



Cultural Space for Teens and Pedestrian Environment Improvements in Seonsuchon-ro, Jwadong for 15 Minutes Life Zone in Busan

Busan invited the public to participate in organizing a 15-minute life zone in Busan and selected two projects to organize which are the 'Dream Sharing Future Space for Kids and Teens' and improving the pedestrian environment in Seonsuchon-ro, Banyeo-dong. The 'Dream Sharing Space' project is to invest KRW15 billion to build a 5-story culture complex space for kids, teens, and local residents near the Jwa 1 dong Administrative Welfare Center. An additional KRW2.5 billion will be secured to improve the pedestrian environment in Seonsuchon-ro, Banyeo-dong. Large-scale

apartment complexes, schools, and retail stores are concentrated in Seonsuchon-ro of Banyeo-dong, thus having a high migratory population. Students use Seonsuchon-ro to commute to school more than any others but the sidewalk is very narrow to walk along. Furthermore, the number of traffic accidents on the road over the past three years has been as high as 60, representing a high risk for such incidents. Haeundae-gu will narrow the road to widen the pavement and install pedestrian crossings which will serve as speed bumps and traffic calming.



Cooking with the Rind of Watermelons

Haeundae-gu has produced a video introducing three summer dishes using the rind of watermelons as a means to reduce food waste, and it has been uploaded on the Haeundae-gu official Youtube channel 'Haeundae, Let's Play.' They consist of a Chinese cold noodle recipe, a Thai glass noodle dish (Yam Woon Sen), and a hot pot with rice and watermelon rind inside. These delicacies of the summer season have now been released.

Extreme Sport 'Skimboard' in Songjeong

Surfing is a sport well known for riding waves from out at sea in towards shore. Skimboarding is riding the shallow water out to the incoming wave and then riding it back to the shore. It allows you to have fun with the waves breaking closer at the beach. Skimboarders can use the board to perform various turns and tricks as they skim out over the water. Because the board is small, thin, and light, it is easy to carry. This sport has not yet become popular in Korea. Aliveskim was the very first skimboard shop to open in 2016 in Korea, and is at Songjeong beach. Jae Hyung Kim, the owner of this shop, learned skimboarding for the first time in 2014. He created a skimboarding club and held the 1st skimboarding contest in November last year. Mr Kim is planning to hold the 2nd Skim Test in October this year.
