Energy directed into making Haeundae a ‘Youth Hope City’

Haeundae-gu plans to carry out sixty projects that will support young people in the region. According to the various youth support plans, Haeundae will provide 100 young people aged 19 to 34 with 500,000 won every month, for up to three months, to cover expenses required for job-hunting. Also, a project named ‘Youth Start-up Business’ will provide money needed for business start-ups and will offer education

theory and skills training. Another support project dubbed ‘H: Start-ups Growth Momentum’ will provide nine youth enterprises with financial assistance. On condition that each company is comprised of at least one full-time worker or more, and has been established within the previous five years. There will be 15 million won in the initial year in supporting rent, materials and development costs and then will be 24

million won per year in personnel expenses subsequently if they hire a new employee the next year. Also eligible for support will be companies in the area of games, animation, film, and video, and small to mid-sized businesses in technical innovation who can receive annual subsidies of 24 million won per person if they hire full-time workers. In the area of housing support, Haeundae plans to provide 200,000 won in monthly

rent (up to 2.4 million won per year) to young, single, and homeless recipients in the region. Furthermore, various activities such as “Youth Talk Concert”, ‘Haeso’ (stress relief) meditation, and psychological consultation programs will be organized in order to help toward mental health for youth.

Galvanizing for a successful bid to host the World Expo 2030

A delegation from the Bureau International des Expositions (BIE) will visit Busan from April 2nd to 7th. Haeundae has been making an all-out effort to generate public enthusiasm and support for hosting the expo by organizing various promotional programs. Among them, Haeundae plans to create an ‘Expo Flower Garden’ in Haeundae Square in Guram-ro and host various events designed to encourage citizen participation. Furthermore, Haeundae’s well

known Sand Festival is forthcoming in May, and has already been titled “Expo Sand Ocean Toward the Future 2030”. These events will galvanize public enthusiasm and keep the momentum toward the November decision point. The venue for the World Expo 2030 will be decided by a vote of 171 member countries in November and the due diligence report prepared by the BIE will be used as the basis for the vote having both a direct and indirect effect.

Support for 2023 new student admissions



Monetary support payments of 300,000 won will be offered to Busan high school freshmen and other high school freshmen located outside Busan regardless of parental income. Students are allowed to spend the money purchasing any school items such as uniforms, books, supplies and so on. You can apply online at (<https://www.gov.kr/-portal/foreigner/en>) from March 20th
